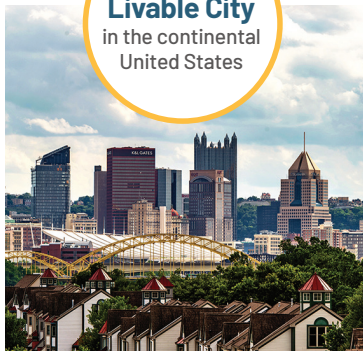

Pittsburgh has more than a few roads less traveled, at least by car: it boasts 700 sets of city-owned step streets. It's also home to the steepest officially recorded public street in the U.S.: Beechview's Canton Avenue, setting for a 2016 commercial for the Audi Quattro A4.

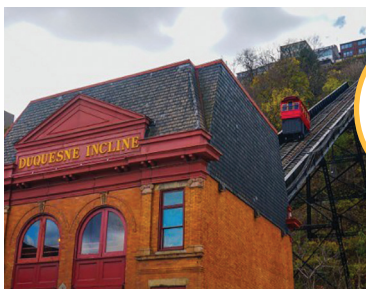

The Economist ranked Pittsburgh the most livable city in the continental United States and 32nd in the world in 2018; in 2019, it was the third most livable, based on metrics including health care, culture and environment, education, infrastructure and crime.



The region goes long on education. Home to 34 colleges and universities — four of them among U.S. News & World Report's Best Colleges rankings — Pittsburgh also has 25 high schools that made the magazine's "best of" list and several elementary schools that won the prestigious Blue Ribbon designation from the U.S. Department of Education.



Pittsburgh lies within 500 miles of more than half the U.S. population and less than a 90-minute flight from half of North America's population. Public transportation options include bus, light rail, and the iconic Monongahela and Duquesne inclines. You can also ride a bike from one of 100 different stations.
